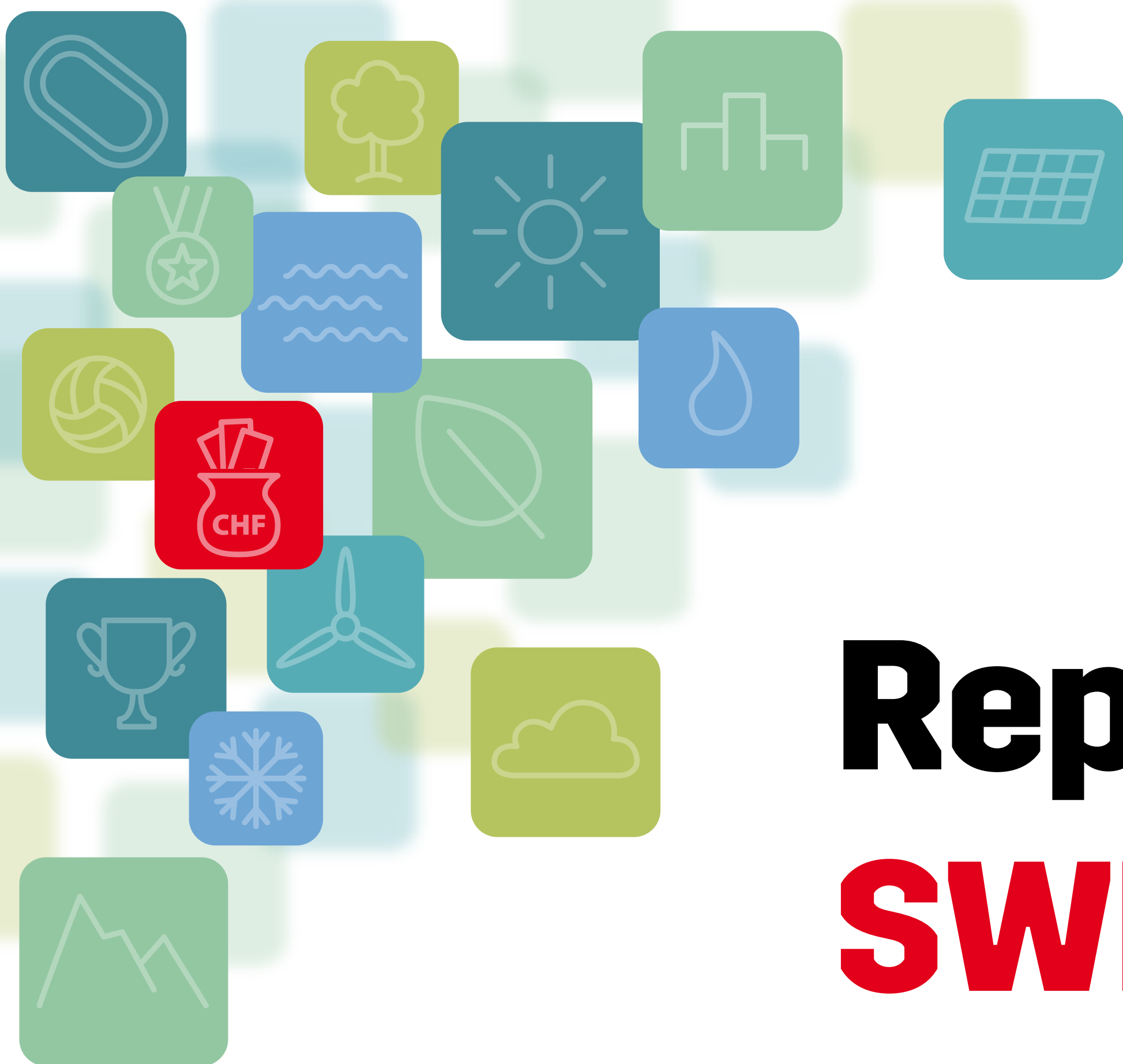




Reporting **SWISS OLYMPIC CLIMATE FUND**

Facts and figures

The Swiss Olympic Climate Fund, launched at the end of 2023, serves as a **funding instrument for climate-protection projects** by Swiss sport for Swiss sport. The fund supports **sustainability efforts and climate-protection projects by Swiss sports federations and clubs**, always

with a view to climate protection and Swiss sport. As the implementing project partner and co-administrator, the myclimate foundation ensures the integrity and impact of the Swiss Olympic Climate Fund. The Swiss Olympic Climate Fund committee decides on the alloca-

tion of the funding on a semi-annual basis. Swiss Olympic, myclimate and various representatives from the contributing federations, clubs and events have seats on the committee.

IOC Climate Action Award 2024

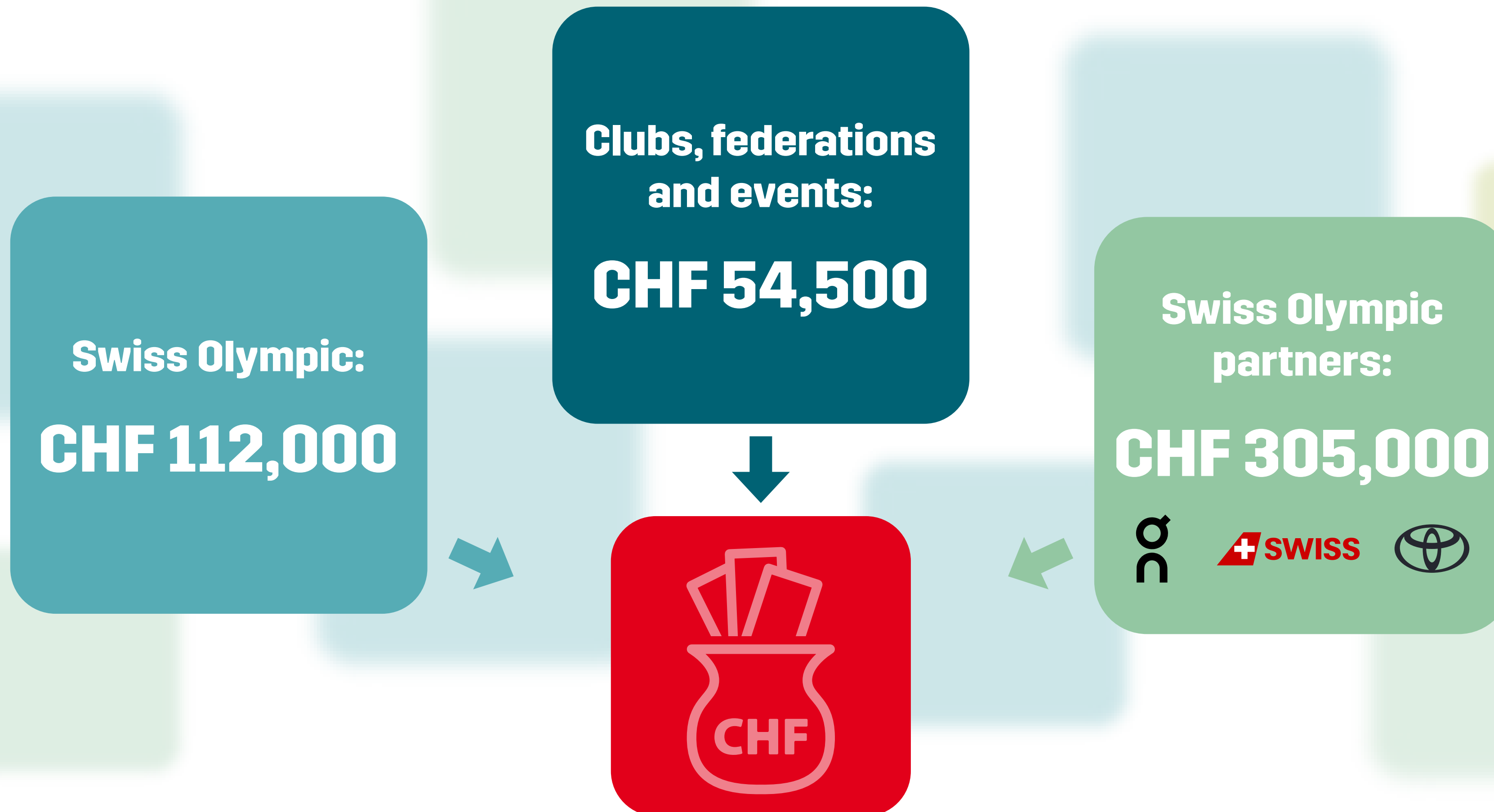
The IOC Climate Action Award in the NOC category went to Swiss Olympic in 2024 for the **Swiss Olympic Climate Fund** project.

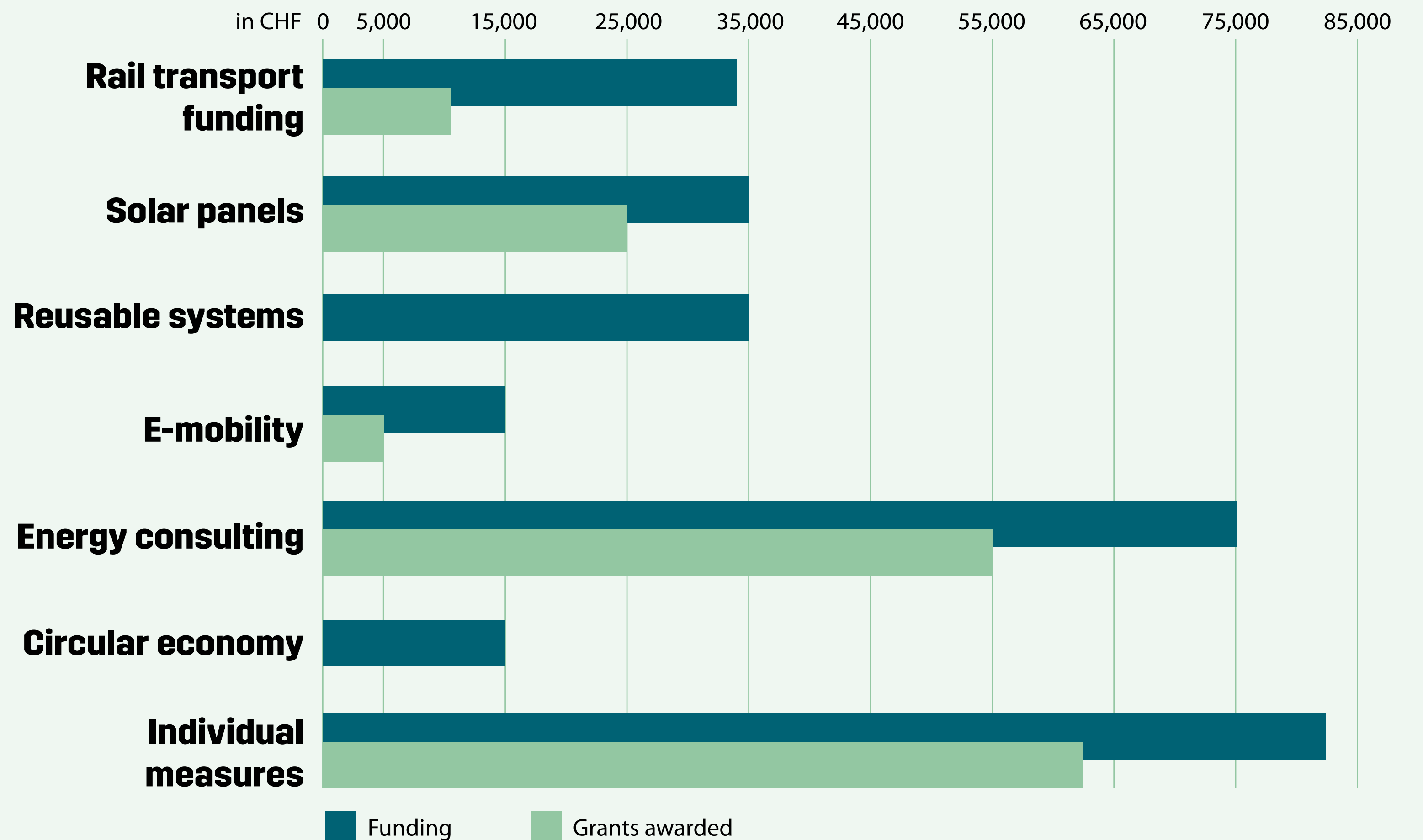

These are summarised here in modules and individual measures.

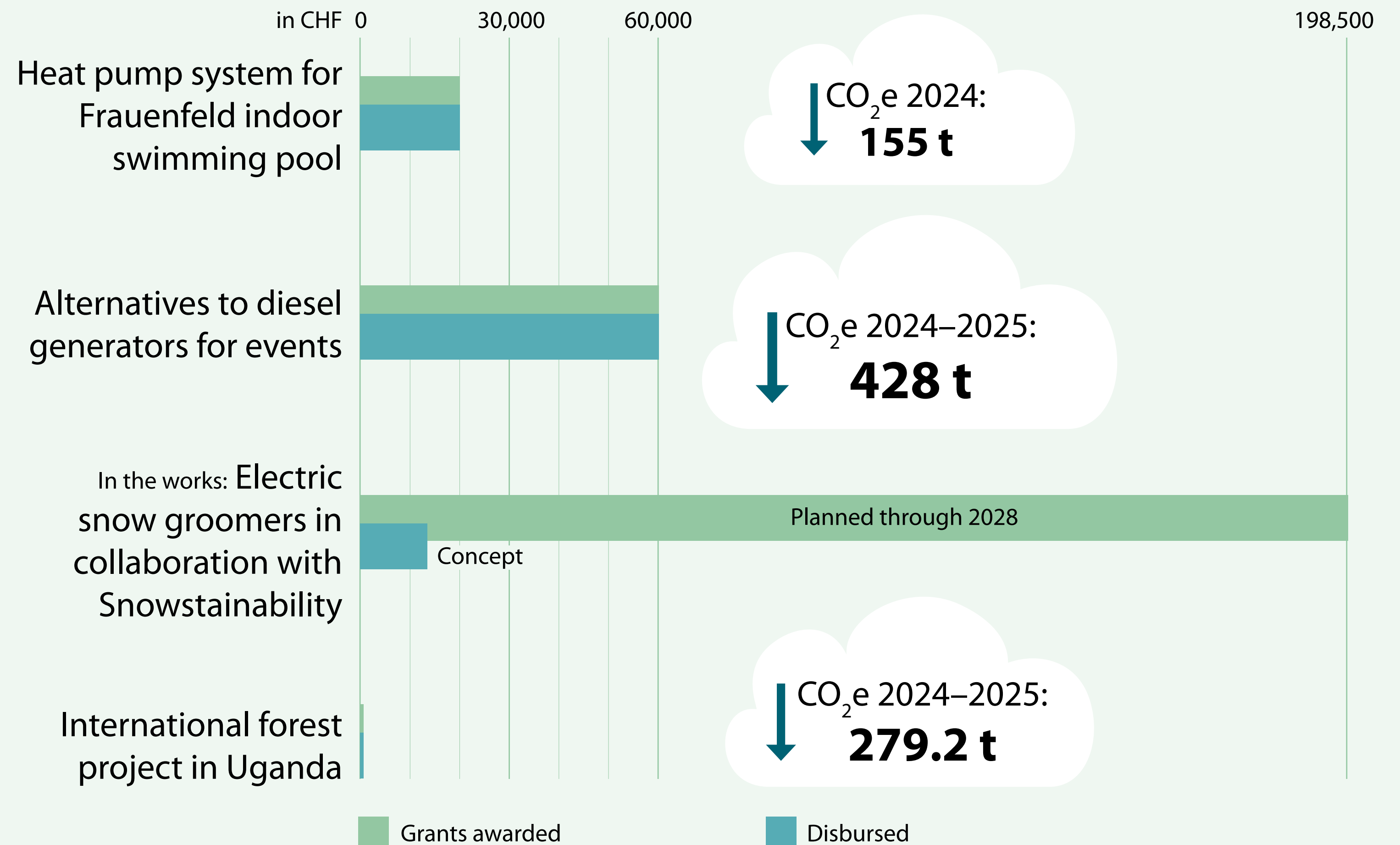

The new **“Home of Beach” in Bern** makes it possible. It was constructed of wood and low-carbon zirkulit concrete from the region.

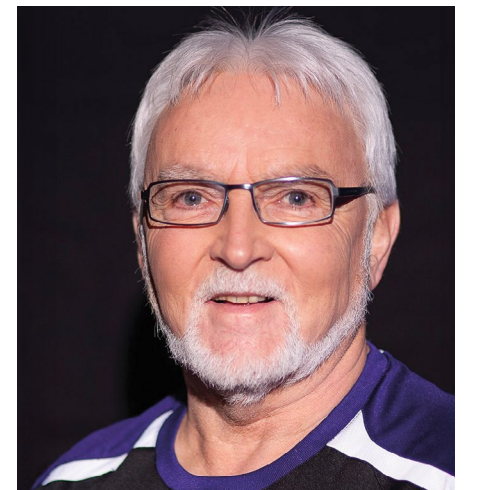

Circular economy

Funding is provided to sporting events that want to implement innovative measures or concepts in the area of the circular economy that go beyond traditional recycling or reusable systems.



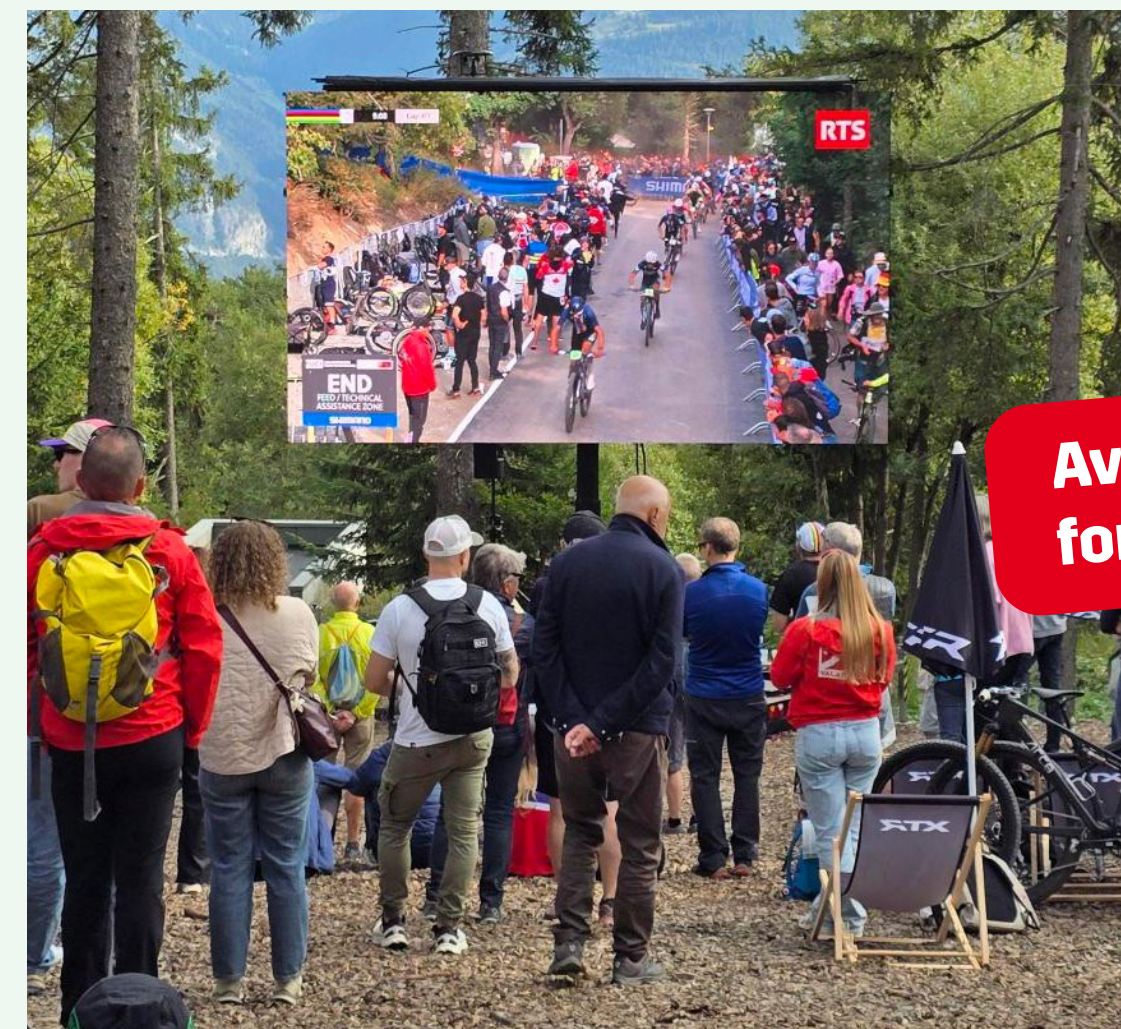
Renting reusable systems

The use of reusable systems for drinks and tableware reduces waste at events and cuts greenhouse gas emissions. Sporting events can apply for funding to rent reusable tableware via the Swiss Olympic Climate Fund.



Climate-protection project: alternative to diesel generators

Through the myclimate climate-protection project, alternatives to diesel generators have been available for rental at sporting events since June 2024.
